Dr. Johnson has a joint appointment as the Frank Miller Professor of Agricultural Economics, and professor in the Harry S Truman School of Public Affairs at the University of Missouri-Columbia. He is Director of the Community Policy Analysis Center. His areas of expertise include rural economic development, fiscal and economic impact analysis, local government finance, and transportation economics. Dr. Johnson's research includes interdisciplinary projects on issues such as bio-energy, land use and transportation. He recently advised the Government of Ukraine on changes to its Agricultural and Rural Development policy, and is studying proposed changes to the European Union's Common Agricultural Policy. He is a founding member of the International Comparative Rural Policy Studies Consortium which includes 8 Universities in Europe and North America. Dr. Johnson is a Fellow of the Southern Regional Science Association and 2006 recipient of the Outstanding Contribution through Economics Award of the Northeast Agricultural and Resource Economics Association.
